

Through collaboration with schools and community organizations, we identify youth who need or want a mentor. By placing a caring adult in the life of a child, Big Brothers Big Sisters creates safe, high-quality, long-lasting mentoring relationships that help vulnerable youth change the odds and reach their full potential through personal and academic achievement. Professionally supported by our staff, individual road-maps for success are developed in concert with parents, children, and mentors.

The **Education Support Specialist** works through collaborative partnerships to help identify and link children and families with resources beyond mentoring including, financial, legal, or work placement assistance, mental health, trauma, and substance abuse counseling, as well as food pantries and utility assistance.

School-Based focuses on personal success and academic achievement through weekly mentoring sessions at the youth's school or virtually. Bigs can enjoy activities such as helping Littles with homework, setting goals, and/or bonding over lunch.

2022/2023 was full of aligned activation of our strategic plan and priorities to Innovate, Engage, and Strengthen our mission and agency in support of our community's youth. For the first time in nearly a decade, the agency proudly experienced growth in terms of number of youth impacted by mentoring relationships, garnering recognition by Big Brothers Big Sisters of America. Additionally, growth was seen in the impact of our programs with increased stakeholder engagement, visible through leveraged partnership with the Florida Prepaid College Foundation, to enhance and deepen existing partnerships unlocking access to scholarship resources for program youth (scholarship administration jumping from \$5k awarded in the 2021/2022 year to \$124k in scholarship value awarded in the 2022/2023 project year). This collaborative partnership is just one example among many of the ways our agency team, Board, and incredible partners continue to work to ensure the quality of our impact remains a priority of our efforts so that more of our community's youth receive the support and resources needed to reach their full potential and live a choice filled future.
